You are being served with a subpoena, attached to this letter, to testify as a witness for the United States of America in a trial currently scheduled to begin in **Dallas, Texas on March 30, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. before U.S. District Court Judge Barbara M.G. Lynn.** You will be notified as early as possible of the date when your actual appearance in court is scheduled. **Please do not make plans to travel to court until we have contacted you regarding the specific date and time of your testimony as court dates can frequently change.**

**If you are not a federal government employee and you do not live within a local commuting distance to Dallas, you must contact Witness Coordinator Lisa Shedden at (800) 496-8341 prior to trial so that she may coordinate your travel and hotel arrangements for you.** Please familiarize yourself with the information on the attached copy of Form OBD-2, Notice to Fact Witness, so that we will be able to reimburse you for all allowed expenses. For your information, any witness who is issued an "open" airline ticket must keep the tickets originally issued in order to board the return flight. State law enforcement witnesses should be advised that if they drive their official vehicle to Dallas, mileage will not be reimbursed. Also, if a state-employed witness testifies in an official capacity, witness fees will be waived.

If you have any questions about scheduling or other matters, please call me; Witness Coordinator Lisa Shedden; SA Chris Smith, Federal Bureau of Investigation at 972.559.5034; Out-of-town federal government employees are urged to contact this office and provide a telephone number where they may be reached in Dallas during trial. If you move from your current address or your telephone number changes, please notify one of the above listed persons as soon as possible. It is important for us to have an accurate record of your address and telephone number in order to contact you during trial preparation.
